The blood of Christ, shed for you.

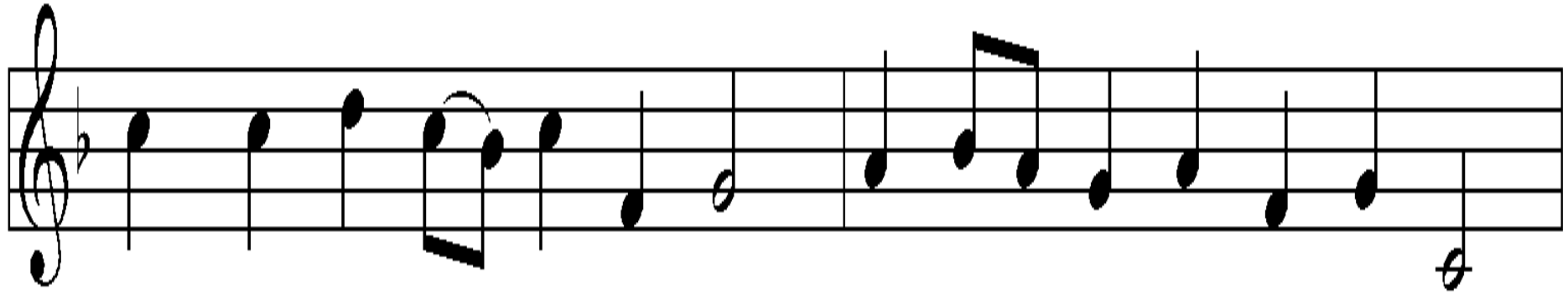
The communicant may say: **Amen.**

* POST COMMUNION CANTACLE

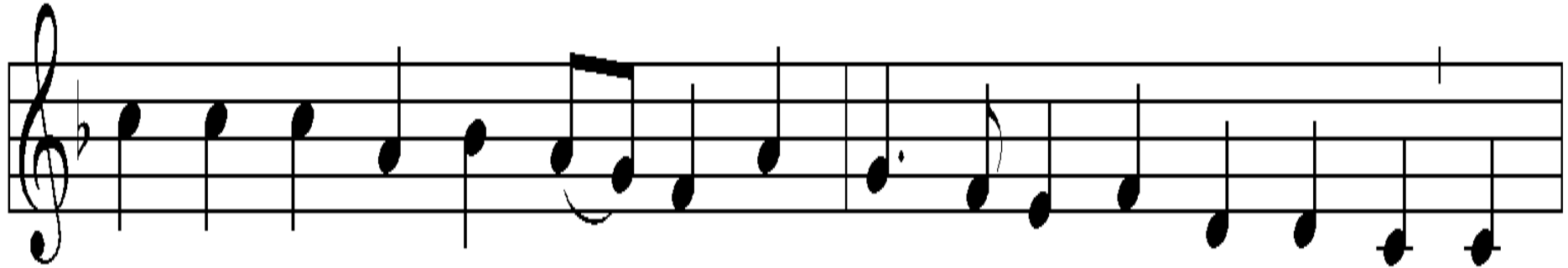

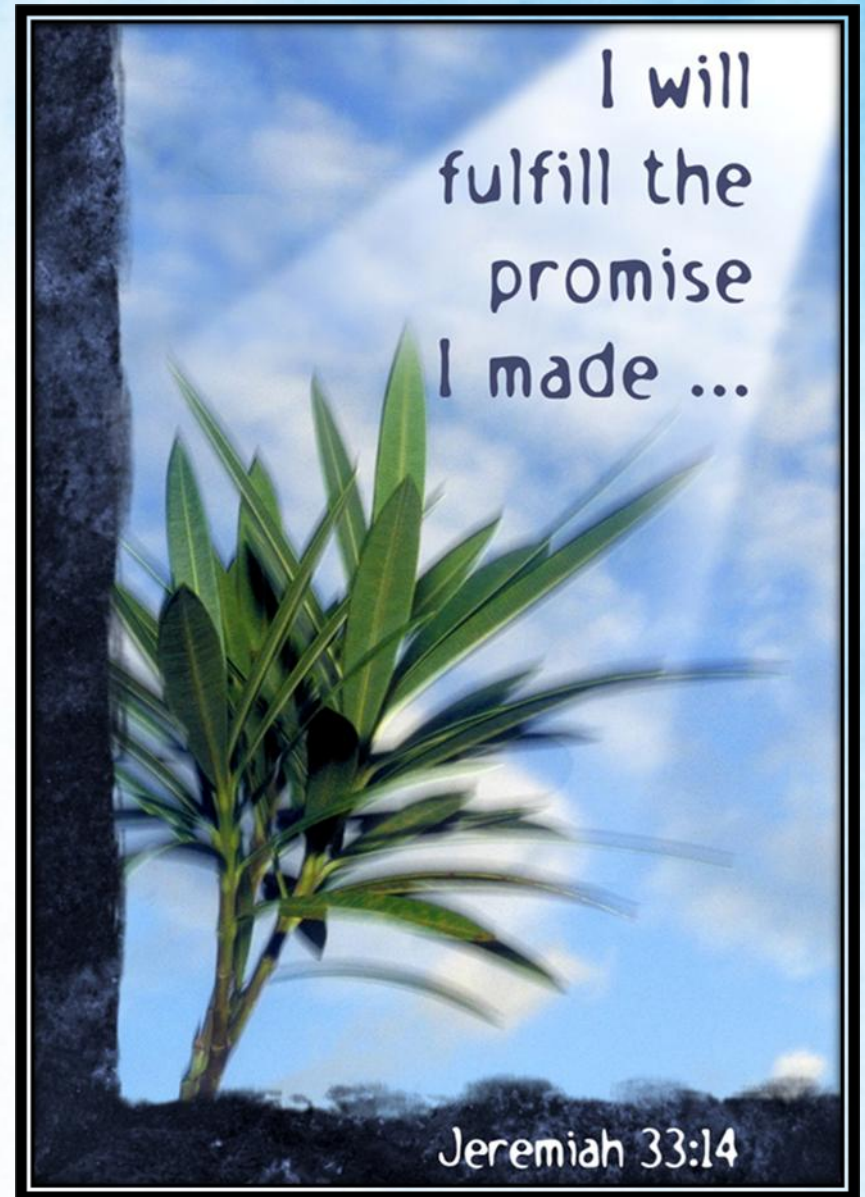
